

# Bog Fritillary

*Boloria eunomia*

-The Bog Fritillary has a very large range. It lives in Alaska and most of Canada, and even comes down into America in the Great Lakes region and Maine.

-The upper-side of the Bog Fritillary is an orange-brown to tan with dark markings. The under-side of the hind-wing is orange with light non-metallic bands.

-True to its name, the Bog Fritillary likes wet areas. The males patrol in wet areas looking for females. The females lay eggs in groups of 2-4 under host plant leaves, which the caterpillars will eat.



Wingspan:

1 ¼ to 1 ¾ inches

Caterpillar hosts:

The caterpillars of the Bog Fritillary feed almost exclusively on the leaves of Willows and Violets.

Adult foods:

Adult Bog Fritillaries feed on the nectar of Goldenrod and Labrador Tea.
