

# Frigga Fritillary

*Boloria frigga*

-The tip of the fore-wing of the Frigga Fritillary is pointed, while all the wings are an orange-brown with black markings. The wing bases of the Frigga Fritillary are darker.

-The habitat that the Frigga Fritillary needs are not the kind of habitats that people think of when they think of butterflies; Sphagnum bogs and the Artic Tundra.

-Male Frigga Fritillaries patrol in low boggy areas for females.



Wingspan: 1 ½ to 2 inches

Caterpillar hosts: The caterpillars of the Frigga Fritillary feed on Cranberry, Bog Rosemary, and Willow

Adult foods: Adult Frigga Fritillaries feed on the nectar of many different species of flowers including Asters, Cup-Plant, and Wild Bergamot.
