-Big Tooth Aspen is a medium sized tree that can grow to heights of 50-60 feet tall and have a diameter of 18 inches. The bark can be a yellowish gray to tan, sometimes with a greenish or orange cast and the leaves appear somewhat later in the spring than those of Trembling Aspen. .

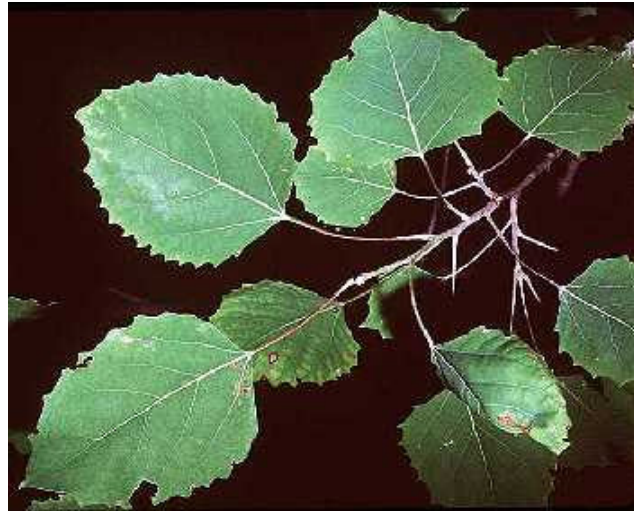
-Big Tooth Aspen is very common throughout Langlade County. It is nice tree to plant because it is very easy to take care of.

-Big Tooth Aspen grow the best in areas that are dry and sandy. It cannot tolerate very wet and poorly drained soils.
