

Green Ash

Fraxinus pennsylvanica

-Green Ash (a.k.a. Red Ash) is a medium-sized tree that will reach heights of 50 feet tall and can have a diameter of 20 inches.

-Green Ash is characteristic of sites that are poorly drained or flooded during the spring, such as stream and lake borders, river floodplains, and bottomlands. It is fast-growing, moderately long-lived, as long as it is planted in full to partial sun.

-The leaves of Green Ash are one of the first to appear in the spring, but they are also one of the first to fall in the autumn, but their color is not as dramatic as the White or Black Ash.

-Green Ash is often planted as an ornamental tree because of its fast growth and relative resistance to summer drought stress and roadside salt injury. It has its' uses, but has limited value in a restoration, except for pure biodiversity.
