Sagittaria cuneata

-This plant grows in the mud or can be submerged in the water. The stem is up to 2 feet in length, and the flowers measure from 6-12 inches in diameter.

-The three-part flower bloom from July through September.

-This common plant of ponds, marshes, and lakeshores, has leaves with long petioles, and they are arrow to linear shaped, with the lower lobes usually much shorter than the top lobes.
