

Yellow Pond Lily

Nuphar advena

-The Yellow Pond Lily is an invaluable plant for Northern Wisconsin lakes. It is also a plant of **Special Concern**.

-Yellow Pond Lilies provide seeds for waterfowl including Mallard, Northern Pintail, Ring-necked Ducks, and Scaup. Deer graze on the leaves, stems, and flowers. Muskrat, beaver, and porcupine eat the rhizomes and the leaves provide shade and shelter for fish as well as habitat for invertebrates.

-The round flower of the Yellow Pond Lily is about the size of a golf ball, or approximately 2 inches.

-Any self respecting bass fisherman will want to plant some lily pads around his dock.
